



According to National Recreation and Parks Association recommendations, Cody Wyoming with a population of 8,835 should have approximately 105 acres of open space distributed among six categories which include playlots, neighborhood playgrounds, neighborhood parks, community playfields, major community parks and urban green spaces. The City currently has over 405 acres of developed park land covering all of the categories listed.

SUMMARY & RECOMMENDATIONS

The Beck Lake Trail System is an important precedent as a type of park for the City of Cody. While most City parks include large turf areas, annual planting beds and assorted play equipment, Beck Lake Park uses mostly native plantings, simple pathways and limited site furnishings. Benches, garbage cans and mutt mitt dispensers provide needed amenities along the paths while picnic tables, bar-b-que pits, and a gazebo help make a comfortable place to gather.

The Lions Club Braille Trail also provides special features including textured pavements and signage for the visually impaired so that they too enjoy the beauty of the natural eco-system.




CIRCLE DRIVE PARK- Urban Green Space

Summary & Recommendations

Circle Drive Park is not a park that people commonly occupy. It is intended to beautify 16th Street and provide a buffer between the main road and the Nielson Addition Subdivision. It has an irrigated turf lawn and small ornamental flowering trees. While it provides an attractive green streetscape for 16th street, the turf lawn uses a great deal of water. Drought tolerant ground covers should be considered for future plantings.




CITY PARK - Major Community Park

Summary & Recommendations

City Park is bordered by Cody High School to the North and Sheridan Avenue to the South. Mature plantings include many large cottonwood trees that provide dense shade from summer sun. Equipped with a full irrigation system, the park supports a turf surface as well as scattered planting beds. Because of its convenient downtown location, the park provides a convenient place for residents, tourists and students to congregate. The park also contains many of the amenities common in major community parks including play equipment, benches, trash receptacles, bar-b-que grills and tables. In addition the park has a miniature golf course, tennis courts, monuments and a picnic shelter. While the band shell is often used by high school students as a hangout, it has also provided a location for such organizations as Shakespeare in the Park to perform. Because of the increased popularity of this and other arts programs there is growing concern that this venue may have become too small.






DACKEN PARK - Neighborhood Park





EAST SHERIDAN SOFTBALL COMPLEX- Community Playfield


GREYBULL HILL - Urban Greenspace



The site contains a few small trees with a light canopy, a few pines and a large number of juniper and potentilla bushes. The shrubbery is surrounded by turf. If these shrubs are not pruned and/or additional plants are added, less maintenance will be necessary. Planting of xeriscape ground cover in place of turf grass could further reduce water use and maintenance.


Summary & Recommendations


Summary & Recommendations


PAUL STOCK PARK - Major Community Park





Benches should be added at the trail connection and additional signage is needed.



This area while large enough to be developed as a community park, Cody has met the need for this type of open space. There are more urgent needs for linear parks that join into the larger pathway system.






Summary & Recommendations

The open space is located adjacent to the Paul Stock Aquatic & Recreation Center and the Victor J. Riley Ice Arena and Community Events Center. In a preliminary design prepared on a pro-bono basis by Rogers Marvel Architects a palette of native Wyoming plant species are organized across the site, as they would grow in the wild. The tapestry of plantings highlights the significance of water use in the arid West and proposes a plan to use this precious resource responsibly.


While the future park could serve an educational role, it could also provide important pedestrian connections to Beck Lake Park, the Shoshone River Trails, and the Paul Stock Nature Trail. Mapping of the space in relation to civic, cultural and recreational amenities helped determine the enormous potential for a series of pedestrian and bicycle trails around the City.

In addition the proposed design suggests the development of a large amphitheater to house the increasingly popular Shakespeare in the Park among other events.

As a potential hybrid of NRPA park types this space could serve neighborhood needs as well as the needs of the greater regional community.








SPIRIT MOUNTAIN SUBDIVISION- Deeded Open Space
